



## **Biobibliography Survey – Summary Report**

Eighty-two of the 270 members of the UC Davis Emeriti Association returned the biobibliography survey, a return rate of over 30%. Not surprisingly, 57% of the respondents retired in the five year period from 1991 to 1995, the time frame in which the Voluntary Early Retirement Incentive Program (VERIP) was offered. Four percent retired in 1983-85, 11% in 1986-1990, 6 % in 1996-2000, and 22% in 2001-2005.

The average age of the respondents is 74 years. Ten percent were born in 1916-20, 15% in 1921-25, 30% in 1926-1930, 24% in 1931-1935, 16% in 1936-1940, and 5% in 1941-45. The biobibliography survey could be completed on-line or by hard copy. Forty percent of the respondents completed the form on-line and their average age was 71. The average age of the 60% who returned the form in hard copy was 78.

Almost half of the respondents have space on campus, 16% have extramural grants, and 14% support 17 individuals including post doctoral fellows, post graduate researchers, undergraduates, graduate students, senior research associates, and staff. Only four individuals expressed need for help, three for secretarial support and one for office space.

The responding emeriti were very productive in the 2003-2005 time period. Twenty-eight percent published a total of 37 books, 55% published a total of 136 articles, 20% authored 48 book chapters, 5% wrote 18 abstracts, 7% wrote 10 professional reports, 14% wrote 70 consulting reports, and 10% wrote 28 book reviews. Three emeriti created artworks, four had exhibitions and one had a theater performance. In total there were 358 publications and creative works. Future productivity is promising as 27% of the respondents reported 48 scholarly works in progress. Thirty percent of the responding emeriti are still teaching, a majority on the UC Davis campus.

The emeriti were also active in university service. Seven percent served on eight Academic Senate committees, 18% served on 34 doctoral committees, 11% on 19 departmental committees and 6% on administrative committees. Participation in support groups included 4% on advisory committees, 14% on Emeriti Association committees, and 2% were involved in fund raising.

The responding emeriti contributed to their professions by serving on committees of their respective professional societies(21%), 9% held offices, 18% have editorial appointments, 30% reviewed a total of 104 articles, and 9% provided other services to their profession. Eighteen percent of

the respondents received honors from their profession. Included were membership in the National Academy of Engineering, Distinguished Career Award from the Society of the Study of Human Development, the Stokinger Award for 2004, the American Society of Nutrition Dannon Mentorship Award, an honorary degree, Award of Honor from the American Society of Agronomy, a building named after an emeritus in recognition of outstanding service to undergraduate students, Gamma Sigma Delta International Award for Distinguished Service in Agriculture, University of Alberta Distinguished Alumni Award, Oregon Department of Agriculture Outstanding District Director Award, and the 2005 Golden Pen Award from the Legal Writing Institute.

Emeriti were also active in community service. Thirty-two percent participated in local activities and 9 % each at the state and national level. Activities included the Yolo Land Trust, director of the Sacramento Symphony Choir, coordinator of the Davis History Research Group, Director of the Polk Soil and Water Conservation Districts, Assistant Governor of Rotary District 5100, facilitator for a local cancer support group, member of the Board of Directors of Blood Source in Sacramento, a member of the UC Davis Choir, and instructor of watercolor painting at the Davis Senior Center.

A wide variety of hobbies were reported. Travel, gardening, and reading led the list. Other interest areas included hunting, fly fishing, writing, listening to music, art collection, cooking, skiing, golf, swimming, tennis, fitness, habitat preservation, genealogy, stamp collecting, painting, photography, politics, and grandchildren.

There was an even split between the respondents who reported that they were less busy than before retiring (41%) and those who were working at about the same level (41%). Ten percent reported they were busier than before they retired, and 8% did not respond to the question.

Sixty-five percent of the respondents (n=53) come to campus an average of 2.5 times per week. Five percent come only a few times per year and 30% do not come to the campus or did not respond to the question.

The summary report and the numerical data collected in the survey have been sent to Charles Berst at UCLA who will compile the data from the nine campuses and develop a systemwide report that will be sent to the President, the Regents, Chancellors and Provosts. The report of the many activities and contributions of emeriti on their campuses, to their professional associations, and their communities helps justify the support of the University and the campus for the emeriti and the Emeriti Associations.

## **CENTER FOR RETIREES RESOURCES AND RELATIONS**

### **PROGRESS REPORT**

The Fall issue of *EmeriTimes* carried the good news that the Center for Retirees Resources and Relations (CRR&R) has been approved by Provost Hinshaw with funding up to \$96, 000 per year for staff, supplies, and equipment. The CRR&R supports the work of the Emeriti and Retirees Associations in providing programs and services that support the campus at its Davis and Sacramento locations and contributes to the continued well being and creativity of retired faculty, staff, and their families. The Provost has appointed an Advisory Committee with representatives from the Emeriti and Retirees Associations, a member who is a retiree but not a member of either association, representatives from Human Resources on campus and the UCD Hospital Services, and a representative of the Office of the Provost. C.E. Hess was elected chair and Charles Lacy, President of the Retirees' Association was elected vice-chair at the inaugural meeting of the committee on October 28, 2005.

The Advisory Committee has met three times and a position description has been drafted for the director. There was some discussion about having a full time person or two half-time persons. The reason for considering two people is that there are two major components of the position; one is to support the UCDEA and UCDDRA, the other is to develop new programs for retirees. It was decided that it would be possible to find an individual that could do both and that it would be too costly to hire two people, including benefits. The position description will be finalized at the January 20<sup>th</sup> meeting and recruitment should begin in February.

The initial location of the Center is tentatively scheduled for Mrak Hall on the third floor where the Office of Research is currently located. It is expected that space will be available in May. The long term location is still planned to be in the new Hotel Conference Center located across from the Mondavi Center.

**AN OPEN LETTER TO EMERITI WHO ARE NOT MEMBERS OF THE UCD EMERITI ASSOCIATION**

Dear Professor Emeritus,

I am writing to invite you to join the UCD Emeriti Association (UCDEA). The UCDEA serves to enhance and protect the interests of retired faculty. The Association working with the Retirees Association and the Provost's Office is establishing a Center for Retirees Resources and Relations to support the activities of UCDEA and the UCD Retirees Association and to enhance retirees participation in campus life by consolidating and expanding program offerings, providing dedicated campus space for offices, and enhancing staff support. Last year UCDEA worked with the campus administration to ensure the continuation of free parking for emeriti and

retirees. We also worked with the administration in the development of a new photo ID card that can be used for the library and other campus facilities.

In the past the activity of the UCDEA has lead to the establishment of a campus based Health Care Facilitator who can provide information about health care benefits and assist in the event of problems with health care programs and insurers. The Association in cooperation with the Retirees Association raised the funds and commissioned the writing and publication of *Abundant Harvest – The History of the University of California, Davis* in 2001. The UCDEA has the Video Records Project that has taped interviews with over 278 emeriti and staff. UCDEA also arranges for the monthly luncheons and speakers held jointly with the Retirees Association and the three General Meetings including the very popular Fall General Meeting dealing with Retirement and Health Care Benefits. The Association prepares a handbook for emeriti that was updated in the Fall of 2005, and publishes three issues of this newsletter, the EmeriTimes.

As reported in the article about the joint meeting of the Council of UC Emeriti Association (CUCEA) and the Council of UC Retirees Associations (CUCRA), there is growing concern about health care benefits for UC Retirees. The University is not obligated to provide health care benefits for retirees. In view of the fact that the projected cost of health care benefits for all employees and retirees by the year 2007 is \$10 Billion, studies are underway to find ways to curtail costs. It is very important that the Emeriti Association play an active role in these deliberations..

We can do a better job of representing the interests of the UCD emeriti if we are able to say that we represent a majority of the emeriti. In addition, the annual dues or life memberships provide the funds necessary to conduct the activities of the Association such as those described above. I urge you to become an active member and support the activities of the UCDEA. A 2005-06 membership form is enclosed with this issue of EmeriTimes.



**REPORT OF THE JOINT FALL 2005 COUNCIL OF UC EMERITI ASSOCIATIONS (CUCEA) AND THE COUNCIL OF UC RETIREES ASSOCIATION (CUCRA) MEETING**

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA SAN FRANCISCO – OCTOBER 27, 2005


Vice Chancellor Gene Washington welcomed the Councils to UCSF and described a mentoring program in which each new faculty member has a mentor. Michael Reese from UCOP gave a presentation on UC's enhanced advocacy program. Enrollment is up 19% and state support for UC is down 15% leading to a \$1.5 billion short fall. There is a lack of connection or support from the public and legislators for the University. Legislators' term limits have eroded institutional memory and interest in long term investments. Federal support is also declining. The bright spot is private support which has grown to \$ 3 Billion/year. The enhanced advocacy program is attempting to build grass roots support for the University among the general public, alumni, parents, and would like help from emeriti and retirees. Also, programs have been developed for business leaders, and legislators and potential legislators. Judy Ackerhalt described the bidding process for the UC/DOE laboratories at Los Alamos and Livermore and the benefit plans for the UC employees who work there.



Randy Scott discussed retirement and health benefit programs. Currently the retirement program is funded at 118%. Although UC salaries have fallen below comparison universities, retirement benefits are 60% above average and health benefits are 10% above average. Given the growing number of retirees in relation to the number of active employees, a requirement for active employees to contribute to the retirement system will be reintroduced probably in

2007. (See figure above) Health benefits have attracted a lot of attention because of new reporting requirements under GASB – Governmental Account Standards Board. Governmental agencies, including the University, have to forecast funding obligations for the benefit of creditors and investors, for example municipal bond holders. The University's projection for the cost of health care benefits for all employees and retirees by the year 2007 is \$10 Billion. (See figure below) Health care costs are a major concern and the University has taken steps to curtail them. For example, it used to be the policy that after 5 years employment a faculty member would receive full medical benefits upon retirement. You now have to be employed 20 years to receive full benefits. In addition, the actions of companies in the private sector to eliminate or reduce retirement support and health care benefits have also raised the level of concern. We were assured that there is no consideration for discontinuing health care benefits for retirees, but there may be changes for new employees as has already happened. Mark Esteban, Director, Health and Welfare Policy and Program Design has been invited to be our May 11<sup>th</sup> luncheon speaker.

value. Also, donors are often happy to be relieved of the responsibilities of property management.




